




Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reading I: Isaiah 8:23-9:3
Reading II: 1 Corinthians 1:10-13,17
Gospel: Matthew 4:12-23

Today's Gospel marks the beginning of Jesus' ministry as recounted by Matthew. Throughout this year the liturgy draws from Matthew. This passage emphasizes two of Matthew's favorite themes: Jesus the fulfillment of the hope of Israel, and Jesus the teacher. Jesus begins to teach with the proclamation: "Reform your lives; the kingdom of heaven is at hand." There is much to be said about what the coming of the kingdom means, and Matthew will lead us to understand this in the weeks ahead. Yet already in today's Gospel we see that it calls for a change. This change is dramatically portrayed in the lives of the first disciples who leave their fishing nets to follow Jesus, as well as in the miraculous healing that accompanies Jesus' teaching. So, too, for us, the coming of the kingdom will mean a letting go of something, but also the discovery of something new.

In 2004, at age 14, our daughter, Sarah was diagnosed with Philadelphia Positive Acute Lymphoblastic Leukemia. She underwent chemotherapy, total body radiation and a bone marrow transplant at St. Jude Children's Research Hospital, where she beat her cancer despite the 30% survival rate she was given. During her treatment, she received blood 34 times and platelets 32 times. Today, Sarah is 28 years old and has been cancer free for 12 years, due in large part to the donors who gave to ensure blood products were available when she needed them most.

John Lancaster Spalding Scholarship Fund Grants

Thank You from St. Vincent de Paul Society

St. Thomas' St. Vincent de Paul Society assistance to the poor all starts with your generous donations and prayer. Our primary financial services support the Food Pantry and provide financial assistance to the poor typically for overdue rent and utility payments sometimes because of eviction and shut off notices. This past year the Society also helped with auto repairs and gas, medical expenses, rent deposits, moving expenses, mortgage payments, a mattress and spring set purchase and diapers and formula, for "No work of charity is foreign to the Society" (from the Rule of St. Vincent de Paul). All payments are made directly to those owed after the need is verified.

In fiscal year 2013, from October 1, 2012 through September 30, 2013, SVdP volunteers made 159 home visits, expending \$52,191.87, or an average of \$328.25 in assistance per visit. The Food Pantry served 1,560 people during the same period. Most of the Pantry's food comes from donated food left in the in the Gathering Space of the church and the Midwest Food Bank. Your SVdP cash donations were also used to purchase out of stock items. In 2013 SVdP also participated in the Christmas food basket program organized at Notre Dame High School.

In November, SVdP volunteers served tornado victims at the Multi Agency Resource Center in Washington, IL.

We do our best to wisely invest your donations where they can make a positive difference in the lives of the poor. Thank you for your generosity.

Last month the Society's collection occurred the weekend we had sever cold weather and snow. This resulted in a smaller collection than normal. This weekend SVdP will again be accepting your donations after all Masses. Your support is always appreciated.
