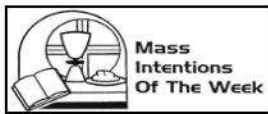

**OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE**

Reading I: Ezekiel	34:11-12,15-17
Reading II: 1 Corinthians	15:20-26,28
Gospel: Matthew	25:31-46

The title of today's feast is somewhat misleading because in order to understand the kingship of Christ we have to forget our preconceptions about kings. The notion of king often conjures up the image of someone who is set apart from the common people. But the lordship of Jesus does not separate him from us; rather it unites us. The Gospel today makes the point even more strongly. The last few Sundays we have been focusing on the end-time and the final judgment. Today's Gospel leaves no questions about the pre-requisites for entrance into the kingdom: feed the hungry, comfort the sick, visit the imprisoned. To love our neighbor (without boundaries) is to love our king. The king is totally identified with the most humble of subjects.

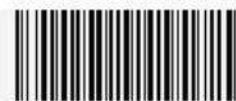

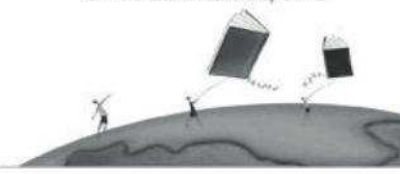

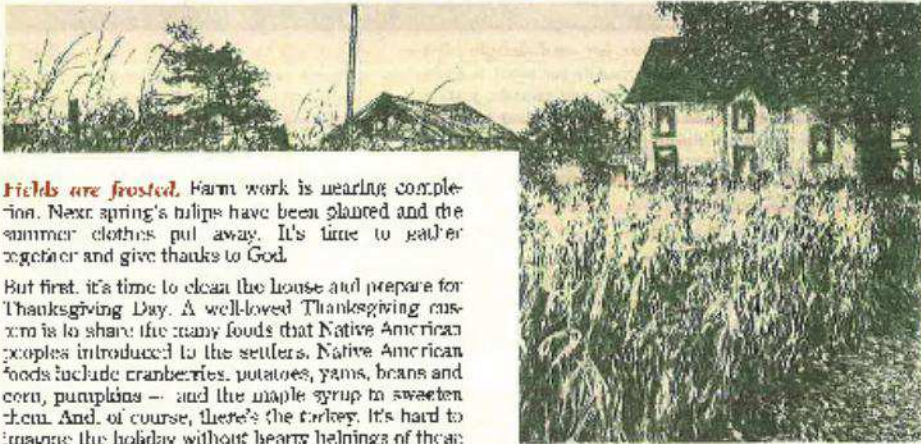

### Come, Ye Thankful People, Come!



**Fields are frosted.** Farm work is nearing completion. Next spring's tulips have been planted and the summer clothes put away. It's time to gather together and give thanks to God.

But first, it's time to clean the house and prepare for Thanksgiving Day. A well-loved Thanksgiving custom is to share the many foods that Native American peoples introduced to the settlers. Native American foods include cranberries, potatoes, yams, beans and corn, pumpkins — and the maple syrup to sweeten them. And, of course, there's the turkey. It's hard to imagine the holiday without hearty helpings of these good gifts.

To make this meal more memorable, perhaps we can make the three days before Thanksgiving Day a fast before the feast. Surely in these busy days of preparation, our meager meals and even skipped meals can be acts of repentance and vigilance that cry to God for justice.

In religious tradition, fasting is complete only when joined by its two companions — prayer and charity. We don't sit down to a feast without making sure that others are enabled to feast as well. St. Leo told us that "our fasts must be turned into banquets for the poor."

# ADVENT

The theme of our Advent journey this year is **STILLNESS**. The Scriptures invite us to listen and wait—be attentive to the movement of the Lord in our lives. We are *still* to ready ourselves that Jesus will be able to enter into our lives more fully. In an effort to do this, we are suggesting a few tips:

- \* *There will have a two minute silent period at the beginning of Mass—after it begins. To aid in the atmosphere of silence, we will keep the doors of the church proper closed and ask that you remain in the Gathering Space until the quiet period is completed. Our hope is that, during this season, you will be able to begin the Mass with everyone in the church.*
- \* *You are invited to stop in the church during the week outside of Mass time for some time of quiet. Just stop for a few minutes. It is a marvelous opportunity to be STILL. Reflection material (if you have that need) will be available. The church is open from 6:30 am — 9:00 pm.*

## Preparing for Advent



The season of **ADVENT** has traditionally been a wonderful time for family activities in the home. In these days when being at home as a family is a precious and sometimes rare experience, we encourage you to make the most of the season of **ADVENT**. Besides the Advent Wreath, we will offer other family activities next week to bring joy as well as teach children the importance of waiting for Jesus to arrive in your family again this Christmas by learning about our common stories of faith as well as experiencing the symbolism of this season.



## ADVENT IN THE HOME

Perhaps the most popular tradition in the home during Advent is the **Advent Wreath**. The Advent wreath reflects the spirit of expectation. The four candles, one more lit each week, helps us in our anticipation of the great event of Christmas, Christ's coming. This custom originated in ancient times with the festival of lighting of fire as the days shortened. It was "christianized" in Europe and has taken on religious significance.

The Advent Wreath, which can be of any size, is circular and made of evergreens, and is placed on a table in the home. There are four candles, one for each week of Advent. Three of the candles are purple, one is pink, the traditional color of the Third Sunday of Advent. A prayer is prayed by the family members and a candle is lit each day—one the first week, etc. Light increases, pushing out darkness. The basic symbolism of the Advent Wreath represents the tension between light and darkness. It represents the long time when people lived in spiritual darkness, waiting for the coming of the Messiah, the light of the world. Each year in Advent we wait in darkness for the coming of the Lord, the anniversary of Christ's birth and His coming into our hearts again.
