

#### **Twenty-sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time**

Amos 6:1a,4-7 1 Timothy 6:11-16 Luke 16:19-31

The message in today's readings is pointed and perhaps harsh. Lazarus and the rich man are models of the "have nots" and the "haves." Could this be a microcosm of what often happens between these two groups in our own society today? Coupled with this story is the reading from Amos which warns us of the attitude which says "we deserve" our blessings. All we have and are is a gift from God. When we truly understand and believe that, then we can begin to live as one with all men and women. To recognize our complete giftedness is to know that without God we are nothing. In this "nothingness" we can identify with the poor, the sick, the victims of injustice—with all peoples. As followers of Christ we are called to recognize and live out a sense of "connectedness" with all humans. When we do this we model Christ.

# Adult Education Fall series 7:00 pm POVERTY IN OUR MIDST

Each of us has been affected, in some way, either directly, through the media or with people we know, by the impact of poverty.

Peoria has experienced the effects of the downturn in the economy. The St. Thomas Food Pantry, the St. Vincent de Paul Society's outreach, to name some of the immediate experiences we have had, indicate a growing need for a better understanding and awareness of the problem facing so many people in our community.

To that end, the social justice committee is offering three weeks of learning, reflecting, and praying about the ways each of us can more effectively make a difference in the lives of others and in our own faith life.

#### Week 2: OCTOBER 1, 2013

What is poverty? What is the difference between generational and situational poverty? What tools can be used to help individuals caught in poverty move beyond it?

—<u>Melissa Willis</u>, a clinical therapist for the Illinois Crisis Prevention Network, who has had extensive experience through teaching in improvished areas as well as counseling individuals who are experiencing extreme lack of various resources, will speak about the many faces of poverty.

#### Week 3: OCTOBER 8, 2013

<u>Spiritual Poverty and Hunger for Life in the Spirit</u>
All of us experience spiritual poverty—that is, we find ourselves depleted of the riches of the spiritual life, either by our own choices or circumstances.

—Father Dick Bresnahan, a priest of our diocese and respected spiritual director, will share insights into the circumstances in our lives that contribute to spiritual emptiness and complacency and give us tools to enrich our spiritual life.
