



### From Our Pastor

After the celebration of the outpouring of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, we honor all three persons of the Holy Trinity this Sunday. This is one of the most fundamental mysteries of our Faith: One God in three persons. We encounter each of these three persons in our own spiritual life. Let us live out this mystery as we follow the example of God the Son who taught us to pray to the Father in Heaven, and who also sent us the Holy Spirit to strengthen us.

Next week we will celebrate Corpus Christi, the great feast of the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. The Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist is another fundamental mystery, one in which we are invited to celebrate every time we come to Mass.

A venerable tradition in the Church is to have a Eucharistic Procession on that day. When the Blessed Sacrament is exposed, it is placed inside the monstrance which is set on the altar for us to pray and adore. Adoration takes place inside the Church in a fixed location. When a Eucharistic Procession is held, the Blessed Sacrament is carried out of the Church into the world. This reminds us that the light of Christ in the Eucharist is meant to shine to the ends of the earth and is to consecrate the world by the offering of the Son.

We will continue this tradition after the 9 AM Mass next Sunday as we carry the Blessed Sacrament in procession around our St. Thomas campus. This procession will take place after Mass around 10 AM and will conclude before the next Mass begins at 11 AM. Please join us for this special devotion.

Please remember in prayer our newly ordained priests, Fr. Nicolas Wilson and Fr. Austin Bosse, as they begin their priestly ministry. May the Lord bless their service to the people of this Diocese!

### **Act of Spiritual Communion**

### St. Boniface

The missionary bishop and martyr St. Boniface (672?-754) has been called the Apostle to the Germans. He was born in England and given the name Wynfrith, which he later changed to Boniface. Until about the age of forty, he was a Benedictine monk, devoted primarily to scholarship; then, in 718, Boniface permanently left England and went to Germany as a missionary.

Christianity in Germany had become riddled with superstition, and was affected by paganism and heresy. Boniface described these conditions on a journey to Rome in 722, and Pope Gregory II thereupon appointed him an archbishop and charged him with reforming and reinvigorating the German church. Boniface worked tirelessly among the Germans, preaching to the pagans and encouraging the Christians, and his efforts met with great success.

Additionally, Boniface did much to promote the unity of the Church in France and Germany with Rome. Though in his seventies, Boniface desired to convert the fierce pagans of Frisia (located in modern-day Holland). He and fifty-three companions went to Frisia for this purpose, but were ambushed and killed by the natives upon their arrival; St. Boniface himself is said to have been stabbed while reading in his tent.

In 1881, with the population of *The Lower End* demanding nearer church accommodations, the parish of St. Boniface arose. The first rector was Rev. F. Von Schwedler, succeeded in 1892 by the Franciscan Fathers who erected the permanent church and school. St. Boniface and St. John merged in 1994 to become St. Ann at the St. Boniface site.

# The Story Behind the Feast of Corpus Christi

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, historically known by its Latin name, Corpus Christi, celebrates the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Holy



Eucharist—Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. It is traditionally celebrated on the Thursday following the Solemnity of the Holy Trinity. The feast dates to the Middle Ages and originated with a visionary nun and a Eucharistic miracle.

#### THE STORY

In 1263 a German priest, Fr. Peter of Prague, made a pilgrimage to Rome. He stopped in Bolsena, Italy, to celebrate Mass at the Church of St. Christina. At the time he was having doubts about Jesus being truly present in the Blessed Sacrament. He was affected by the growing debate among certain theologians who, for the first time in the history of the Church, began introducing doubts about the Body and Blood of Christ being actually present in the consecrated bread and wine. In response to his doubt, when he recited the prayer of consecration as he celebrated the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, blood started seeping from the consecrated host and onto the altar and corporal.

Fr. Peter reported this miracle to Pope Urban IV, who at the time was nearby in Orvieto. The pope sent delegates to investigate and ordered that host and blood-stained corporal be brought to Orvieto. The relics were then placed in the Cathedral of Orvieto, where they remain today (see photo below).

This Eucharistic Miracle confirmed the visions given to St. Juliana of Mont Cornillon in Belgium (1193-1258). St. Juliana was a nun and mystic who had a series of visions in which she was instructed by Our Lord to work to establish a liturgical feast for the Holy Eucharist, to which she had a great devotion.

After many years of trying, she finally convinced the bishop, the future Pope Urban IV, to create this special feast in honor of the Blessed Sacrament, where none had existed before. Soon after her death, Pope Urban instituted Corpus Christi for the Universal Church and celebrated it for the first time in Orvieto in 1264, a year after the Eucharistic Miracle in Bolsena.

Inspired by the miracle, Pope Urban commissioned a Dominican friar, St. Thomas Aquinas, to compose the Mass and Office for the feast of Corpus Christi. Aquinas' hymns in honor of the Holy Eucharist, Pange Lingua, Tantum Ergo, Panis Angelicus, and O Salutaris Hostia are the beloved hymns the Church sings on the feast of Corpus Christi as well as throughout the year during Exposition and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament


