From Our Pastor

In the past weeks, I have spent time reflecting on receiving Communion. It is important that we be in a state of grace when receiving the Lord. We should also be in communion with the Church by professing all those things that are at the heart of our Catholic Faith. Among those beliefs is the fundamental truth that we are all created in the image and likeness of God, and that human life is precious and sacred.

The Bishops throughout the United States are taking up the question about the circumstances in which a public person should not receive Communion. At what point does a person hold a public opinion fundamentally opposed to a core teaching of our faith? In order to demonstrate the complexity of this issue, I have highlighted several political questions related to the right to life. Various elected officials hold a variety of opinions on each of these issues:

Should access to abortion be legal? Should access to abortion be free of charge? Should Federal and State laws be able to restrict abortion? Should judges be appointed with a view to protecting abortion? Should abortifacient medications be restricted? Should the Hyde Amendment, the Helms Amendment, or the Mexico City Policy be supported? (The Hyde Amendment states that no taxpayer dollars shall be used to fund abortion in this country. The Helms Amendment states that no US foreign aid funds shall be used to perform abortions, while the Mexico City Policy restricts foreign aid from promoting abortion.)

Some further issues: Should Planned Parenthood be federally funded? Should health care programs provide education to reduce the number of unintended pregnancies? Should expectant mothers have access to health care including adoption programs? Should public policies be supported to make abortion "safe, legal, and rare" or "less necessary"? Should individual conscience be respected in reproductive decisions? Should religious and ethical concerns about abortion be recognized?

Please remember to pray for our Bishops as they consider this complex question. At what point does a public person hold an opinion no longer consistent with living in communion with the Catholic Church? Next week, I will consider the pastoral response the Bishops can adopt in these circumstances.





Safety Tips from Peoria Heights Police

The Heights Police were here this past week and gave a great presentation on personal safety. Here are a few highlights:

- Telephone scammers will ask to verify your information, this is a Red Flag—the legitimate agency will already have this information so never give it out:
 - Ask for caller's name, phone number, extension number—this will usually result in a hang-up
- Government agencies will NEVER call—Social Security, IRS, Medicare, Unemployment, etc.—they use the US mail to contact you.
 - If you receive a letter from IL Unemployment offering to start your claim—DO NOT respond; this is a scam. If you need to file for unemployment you must contact them.
 - The Police will never call for tickets, fines, relative in jail, etc.
- Someone coming to your house seeking for work:
 - Ask for Business License number, Insurance number, Bond number, business address and phone number—all legitimate businesses have these and are happy to share.



- Before hiring, check with the Better Business Bureau—if the business is legitimate, there will be some record at the BBB.
- When choosing someone use word-of-mouth recommendations, BBB information; avoid randomly calling any unfamiliar business.
- If you have hired someone to do work and they are slow to finish it, or show up randomly, or ask for more money, and ultimately to not finish:
 - You can report this to the police
 - If you work out a deal with the worker, and they still do not finish, it is no longer criminal, it is a matter for the civil court
- If you are at one of the downtown Court Houses after dark, or any of the 3 Peoria hospitals after dark—ask for an escort to your car—they are happy to help you.
- Phone calls asking for disaster donations are scams—the Red Cross does not call.
- Mace will hurt you as badly as the person you want to spray—better to use a whistle, there is one that works by pulling the plug
- When going to your car in public places, do it purposefully:
 - Walk straight to your car with keys in your hand ready to use;
 - Get in as quickly as you can and close and lock your doors quickly. You can fuss with your things once you are in—do not sit with the door open.
 - If you do see someone suspicious, go back into the store and if needed call police from there.
 - If the someone suspicious is in the store, report to the manager—it is their job to deal with the person.
- Door-to-door sales are legal, but the person must have a Peddler's License (Peoria Heights, yes; check with other towns) - you can ask to see this.
- Pandering is now legal—if uncomfortable, lock doors and keep windows up, avoid eye contact
- If in doubt—call: 911 for any emergency—it will route to the correct agency. For all non-emergencies: Peoria Police 697-7841; Peoria Heights Police 697-7841; Peoria Co. Sherriff 672-6011; Better Business Bureau 688-3741


