

The Season of Lent begins this week with Ash Wednesday. I am allowed to celebrate up to three Masses on Sundays and other days of obligation, so please note:

- Masses for Ash Wednesday will be offered at 7 AM, 9:15 AM (school Mass), and 7 PM
- At 12:15 PM we will have an Ash
 Wednesday Service outside of Mass,
 with the Liturgy of the Word, the
 distribution of Ashes, and the
 distribution of Holy Communion.

On the Fridays of Lent, we will add confessions and adoration at 6 PM and Stations of the Cross at 7 PM. I am grateful to the Franciscan Sisters of John the Baptist who have prepared Station books with our own mosaic stations. These will be a special blessing to us as we meditate on the Passion of our Lord.

On the Sundays of Lent, I am also happy to add additional confessions between our morning Masses, from 9:00 to 9:45 AM, and before our Sunday evening Mass, from 4:15 to 4:45 PM.

With the help of the Franciscan Sisters, we have found special angel holy water fonts that we can place in the narthex. When these angels are placed, we will move our missalettes into the pews, which should be more convenient for everyone. Those who wish to use one of our large print missalettes for Mass can pick them up in the narthex.

I am very grateful for the installation of new blinds in our cry rooms, which are both very attractive and more functional. With the help of our Buildings and Grounds committee, and with the melting of snow and ice on the roof, we have hopefully addressed the leaks in the narthex.

Thank you to the Knights of Columbus for making available the traveling icon of St. Joseph, the guardian of the Christ Child. We will have the icon available for a short time until it moves to the next parish.

I am grateful for your support of our men's group and the food pantry for our small appliance drive. Your charity will help provide needed items, in addition to food donations, for those in need in our community.

Count your blessings! I say this to myself so often as I meet people who call on the St. Vincent de Paul Society. There but for the grace of God.

Some are stuck in situations that make their lives a constant struggle just to get by, leaving them with little hope and very few resources. We sometimes offer financial assistance, and we always offer concern and information on community agencies that might be of assistance. Occasionally we meet a person who is trying hard to make their future better than their past or present. A recent caller, a single mom with four children, needs help because she knows she needs to get into a career that will provide a higher, stable income. She is currently enrolled in the nursing program at ICC, scheduled to graduate in December. But, because the curriculum is intense, counselors told her she cannot continue to work full time; therefore, she cut back to twenty hours per week at the nursing home where she has been employed for several years. Imagine working, going to classes and hospital clinicals, studying, and taking care of four children! We helped her with a rent payment, but she will need more than we can provide over the next several months. Please keep her in your prayers.

That's why DHHS, the CDC and the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services are leading the *Million Hearts®* national initiative https://millionhearts.hhs.gov. Federal, state and local agencies and private-sector partners also provide support for the campaign.

Million Hearts encourages Americans to make lifestyle choices that could decrease their chances of suffering a heart attack or stroke:
Use aspirin when appropriate; Control blood pressure; Manage high cholesterol; Stop smoking; Lower sodium consumption; Lower trans fat consumption

What Can You Do?

To protect yourself, stay smart about your heart:

Know the signs of a heart attack, and stroke (see next week's bulletin)
Keep your weight, blood pressure and cholesterol in a healthy range.
Talk to your doctor about your numbers and ask if medication is needed.
Exercise most days of the week.

Do not smoke or use tobacco.

Limit alcohol use.

If you think you are having a heart attack, call 911 right away. And if you haven't had regular heart screenings with your doctor, start today.
