

Our Parish Mission starts Sunday evening at 6:00 p.m. Please join us as we welcome Michael Gormley as he addresses living out our faith not just on Sunday but in every aspect of our life. The Mission continues Monday evening at 6:00 p.m. Confessions will be available on Monday after the Mission.

On the Fifth Sunday of Lent, we enter Passiontide, a time that is more intensely focused on the preparation for the Passion. Our attention is more focused on these spiritual mysteries as we remove more and more distractions. As we get closer to the Passion, we are invited to be more mindful of ways we can purify our lives and detach ourselves from worldly things. Even the practice of silence is a way to disconnect from the busy activity of the world around us. Let us use the silent time after Communion to be more available to God in prayer.

On Palm Sunday, we begin Holy Week. As in past years, we will have a solemn procession with palms at our principal Mass at 10:00 a.m. You will be invited to gather in the Narthex for the reading of the first Gospel of the entrance into Jerusalem and then to process into the church as we begin the Mass and listen to the Passion.

The priests of the Diocese will gather with Bishop Tylka on Tuesday of Holy Week to celebrate the Chrism Mass. Bishop Tylka will bless the holy oils that we will use for the next year. If you would like to attend, please come to the Cathedral at 1:00 p.m. on April 4th.

Please note our Holy Week schedule, especially the special Masses we will have for the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, the Liturgy of the Passion on Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday.


