#### From Our Pastor

On Sunday, we presented the Growing Disciples program of the Diocese. We are not anticipating any change in our parish status, some other parishes in the Diocese will experience a merger and some smaller churches may be taken out of service. However, the Diocese wants every parish to grow in discipleship to become more vibrant. I appreciated the discussion that followed the presentation in which we spoke about ways to enliven our parish.

The most significant measure of vibrancy is church attendance. Our parish, like all the other parishes in our region and throughout the Diocese, has seen a decline in the attendance in the years before COVID. Naturally, the drop during the pandemic was significant, and we have seen an increase in attendance, but not to the same levels that we had before 2020. The most important priority for every parish must be drawing more of the faithful to participate in Sunday Mass.

Our goal should not be to worry about which parish a person attends, whether they prefer Mass at one parish over another. Our goal should be to draw people who are not attending Mass to return. In particular, I encourage our younger generations, our young adults, and especially our school families to make Sunday Mass a part of your family routine. Jesus offered himself on the cross for our salvation, and he holds his arms open wide to receive us when we come to him.

Every fall, we invite new nominees to serve on our Parish Council. The discussions in the Parish Council will be an important part of our efforts to encourage a wider return to the practice of the faith among those who have been away. Please consider those who might be a good addition to our Parish Council at St. Thomas.

Last Sunday, we also discussed other ways to promote involvement, such as by helping as an usher or a greeter at Mass. We talked about resuming a more active role for our ushers in a more involved parish. The only obstacle: I need willing volunteers. Among those who come to Mass, not everyone feels comfortable or capable of volunteering, whether as an usher, a reader, a cantor, or a musician. I look forward to engaging with the Parish Council to encourage more volunteerism. For now, I ask you to consider how you might take on a more active role at St. Thomas.






