From Our Pastor

This year, Easter and the Season of Lent fall earlier than usual. Ash Wednesday will be celebrated on Wednesday,

which happens to be Valentine's Day. (I suggest spouses may find it easier and even cheaper to celebrate on Tuesday or Thursday instead!)

As we begin Lent, be mindful of the law of fast and abstinence. Ash Wednesday is a day of fasting for those between 18 and 59 years of age. Ash Wednesday and every Friday of Lent is a day of abstinence from meat for those 14 and older. In addition, we are all urged to take up our own personal penances and sacrifices during the season. This is a profitable time for us to grow in our spiritual life by walking with our Lord as he carried his own cross.

In addition to penance, Lent is also a season of increased prayer. Many people find daily Mass to be a helpful source of enrichment. Our daily Masses are offered during the week at 7 and 8 am, except on school Mass days when Masses are at 7 and 9:15 am. You are encouraged to join in the Rosary recited between the daily Mass times as well as on Tuesdays at 10 am.

We will continue our regular Friday devotions with adoration and confessions offered Friday evenings from 6 to 7 pm, followed by Stations of the Cross at 7 pm. Confessions will continue to be offered on Saturday afternoons both before and after the evening Mass. Additional confession times will also be added during the season.

Please pray for the candidates in OCIA who are preparing to enter the Church at the Easter Vigil. This is a special time in their formation as the day of their entrance into the Church grows nearer.

May this time of penance be a spiritual gift to us to strengthen our faith.

My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As we enter into this Lenten season, the Church once again invites us to use this opportunity to share more fully in the Paschal Mystery of Jesus Christ. It is essential that we cultivate a deeper sense of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving to better offer our lives to Our Lord.

As we make our way through the Triduum and to that glorious day of the Lord's Resurrection, I pray that all of us will be ever more attentive to our spiritual devotions and especially to the Word of God during these forty days. May the guidance of the Holy Spirit assist us in our Lenten journey.

REGULATIONS FOR LENT AND THE EASTER TRIDUUM

Lent is the principal season of penance in the Christian year. Priests, religious, and laity are strongly urged to develop and follow a program of voluntary self-denial, attentiveness to prayer, and especially to works of charity and mercy.

Everyone of 14 years of age or over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, February 14, 2024, and all the Fridays of Lent.

Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 years of age is bound to fast on Ash Wednesday, February 14, 2024, and Good Friday, March 29, 2024.

On these two days of fast and abstinence, Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.

To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is a serious matter.

May our Lenten journey bring us closer to the cross and our Resurrected Savior.





Thank you to all our parishioners who completed surveys and provided feedback regarding the second draft models as part of our Growing Disciples initiative. Gathering information from you is a critical element in the ability to move forward in this important pastoral planning process.

Since the Parish Meetings in October, CLI has diligently compiled the thousands of electronic and paper surveys, along with the letters offering feedback regarding the second round of draft models. The Core Team has reviewed the data and met to propose the final draft models. In the coming month the Diocesan Pastoral Planning Commission will review their work. It will then be submitted to the Presbyteral Council to make recommendations for the Bishop to consider in the final decisions. Bishop Tylka is most grateful for all the work that has brought us to this point and asks for your continued prayers during this time of discernment.

The Diocese of Peoria is constantly updating the website (growingdisciplescdop.org) with additional information about the Growing Disciples initiative, so check back frequently.

Let us remain a people of prayer: praying for each other and supporting one another as we go through this process.

Throughout his pontificate, our Holy Father, Pope Francis, has often spoken of the need for Christians to evangelize through accompaniment. 
