From Our Pastor

The month of May is dedicated especially to the Blessed Virgin Mary. St. Thomas School will hold a May Crowning on May 1st.

When you go to the poor, you encounter Jesus

The work of the St. Vincent DePaul Society has value far beyond meeting the physical needs of the

poor. I routinely hear our members say they receive more than they give.

Being poor does not always, or necessarily, consist of being short of material goods. Being poor can also mean being physically and mentally handicapped, sick, crippled, old, ugly, or illiterate. There are poor who are or are made to feel alone...immigrants, transients, orphans, the abandoned or rejected, and all those who find themselves among others who are indifferent or hostile. Being poor may mean wanting to cry when others are laughing; being physically or morally chained, as prisoners, shutins, alcoholics, drug addicts; being defenseless against attacks, insults or accusations; being an innocent victim of crime or quarrels. (McCullen, Deep Down Things)

My work with the Society of St. Vincent DePaul continually challenges and changes me. The importance of the process of being available, and then assigned to minister to individual human beings who reach out in need is priceless. The value of being part of a team who collectively works at opening their hearts to the poor is beyond measure. We are stretched to provide financial help, but perhaps more importantly sometimes, to place intangible assistance of our personal resources like potential of mind and heart, time, and influence at the service of others. Sharing means taking part in the joys and sorrows, worries and the hopes of others.

Your continued generous donations are multiplied far beyond the dollars they represent. And I know I speak for all of our volunteers when I thank you for this sacred experience.
