From Our Pastor

As we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord, I am thankful for the great number of baptisms we have had over the past year. This is a sign of growth and vitality in the parish. Parents are encouraged to have their children baptized soon after they are born. We ask parents to participate in a brief baptism class before the baptism of their first child in order to review the responsibilities they are undertaking. Parents may also choose one godfather and one godmother as godparents. At least one godparent must be a baptized and confirmed Catholic in good standing. Baptisms can be scheduled during our Sunday 10:00 a.m. Mass or, more commonly, after this Mass at 11:00 a.m. When Sunday is not convenient, we can also schedule a baptism on another day of the week.

If a child wasn't baptized as a newborn or as an infant, it is still never too late. We have worked with several families this year to catch up on sacraments. Once a child has passed the normal age for First Communion, we will work with the child not only to prepare him or her for baptism, but also for confession and Communion. If you need help catching up on any sacraments, please contact me or Mary Cushing, our Director for Faith Formation.

The Baptism of the Lord marks the end of the Christmas Season and our return to Ordinary Time. I especially single out the Franciscan Sisters of St. John the Baptist for their heroic work in decorating the church and organizing the sacristy at St. Thomas. I don't think any other church in the Diocese is better cared for. Thank you, Sisters!

With the new year, we also return to our regular routines as we welcome back St. Thomas School students and CCD students for a new semester. As our students are welcomed back, we will have a Donut Sunday with coffee and donuts after Sunday morning Masses.

The adults taking part in OCIA are returning for their final months of preparation before entering the Church at Easter. Our programs for adult spiritual enrichment are also available to all parishioners. Women of the Word has started again, meeting every other Thursday evening. That Man Is You will start at the end of the month, meeting every Friday morning.

After the special events of the Advent and Christmas Season, I take some time away for vacation, but I look forward to seeing you next weekend.




Your child can attend a Catholic School Financial Assistance Is Available

Tuition assistance scholarship grants from the endowment fund established as a result of the Diocese of Peoria ROOTED IN FAITH Campaign and named in honor of Archbishop Spalding, the first Bishop of Peoria, will be available for the 2025 -2026 school year for students enrolled in or intending to enroll in grades Kindergarten through 12 in any Catholic school located in the Diocese of Peoria whose families are active members of a Catholic parish in the diocese. All grants will be based on financial need objectively assessed.

Information about the grants and application materials may be obtained from any Catholic elementary or secondary school in the Diocese of Peoria or on the Diocesan website **www.cdop.org** under Catholic Schools and then under John Lancaster Spalding Scholarship. Consult the detailed protocols and procedures and checklist at the bottom of the webpage for all requirements necessary to be eligible for an award.

Parents must apply online at: online.factsmgt.com/aid. Families of students currently receiving grants are reminded that all grants are for one year only, and anyone seeking to renew a grant for the 2025-2026 school year must reapply.

Deadline date for the completed application is April 25, 2025. Notification of grant awards will be made in June of 2025.

Reflection for The Baptism of the Lord

Did the first reading from Isaiah sound familiar? We also hear it on the first Sunday of Advent every few years. I suppose it could be a reminder that John the Baptist appears at the beginning of the Advent/Christmas season and at the end. In Advent we were preparing for Jesus' coming at Christmas. Now we are preparing for his coming at any time.

The reading from Isaiah talks about the Lord coming in mercy to the people whose guilt is explated (Isaiah 40:2). With our sins forgiven we need not fear asking God for help: Fear not to cry out (Isaiah 40:9). The Lord comes in power, not to strike sinners down but to shepherd them and lead them.

In the second reading, St. Paul has a similar theme. Jesus gave his life for us on the cross so that we could be free to give ourselves in love as he did. No matter how bad I was in the past, the Lord loves me enough to forgive it all, and even better, to give the Spirit to help me stay close to God.

How do we prepare for this? We can start by hearing the words of the readings today, letting them sink into our hearts and minds. Ask the Spirit to help look for ways you can be more loving with your family, then with your friends, and eventually with anyone who needs your help. When we let that Spirit guide us, we become like Jesus in that we can listen for God to say, You are my beloved child; with you I am well pleased (see Luke 3:22). Tom Schmidt
