

From Our Pastor

We just celebrated Catholic Schools' Week, so I would like to salute the teachers and staff of St. Thomas School for all their hard work in making this past week successful.

In the fall, we had a broken pipe in the kitchen that partially flooded the school cafeteria. This was repaired and the water was taken up. However, the water also overflowed into the school gym. The water was removed, but the full extent of the damage was not immediately known. Over the past months, it has become clear that water seeped into the area beneath the wood floor and began to warp the wood. We have tried to resolve this issue, but the damage to the wood floor has not been able to be repaired.

Fortunately, this falls under our property insurance, so the damage will not affect St. Thomas Parish or School. Our claim has been approved by our insurance carrier, and we will be soon replacing the gym floor. The good news is that the cost of replacement has been covered. The bad news is that we will not be able to use the school gym for approximately 6 to 8 weeks while the new floor is installed.

Please be patient while we work through this project. Sports practice and games have been relocated and some of our events will be moved to a different location or rescheduled. This will affect the schedule for Trivia Night and our Lenten Fish Fry.

Please join us for our upcoming Progressive Dinner on Saturday, March 1st. We will gather for appetizers and then guests will move to various homes for dinner before concluding at the Country Club of Peoria. The proceeds will help refurbish the school library and other areas in the school in need of repair.

Those who are interested in participating in our choir are welcome to join. Steve Harms will hold choir practice on Sunday mornings before our 10:00 a.m. Mass. Please volunteer by adding your voice to our singers and musicians at St. Thomas.

Doing God's Will

Jesus said to pick up your cross and follow me. Your cross, meaning all your problems and life's challenges and still do His will no matter what.

We were able to get her old bill paid to get the power turned on, and we also helped her out with some furniture and we signed her up for the Giving Tree at St. Thomas. Because of all your generosity she and the kids had a gift filled Christmas. Not everyone can actively seek the poor. But a good way to do God's will is to actively support St. Vincent de Paul Society. We can do the leg work for you. Like the widow - please give until it hurts a little.


Your child <u>can</u> attend a Catholic School Financial Assistance Is Available

Tuition assistance scholarship grants from the endowment fund established as a result of the Diocese of Peoria ROOTED IN FAITH Campaign and named in honor of Archbishop Spalding, the first Bishop of Peoria, will be available for the 2025-2026 school year for students enrolled in or intending to enroll in grades Kindergarten through 12 in any Catholic school located in the Diocese of Peoria whose families are active members of a Catholic parish in the diocese. All grants will be based on financial need objectively assessed.

Information about the grants and application materials may be obtained from any Catholic elementary or secondary school in the Diocese of Peoria or on the Diocesan website <u>www.cdop.org</u> under Catholic Schools and then under John Lancaster Spalding Scholarship. Consult the detailed protocols and procedures and checklist at the bottom of the webpage for all requirements necessary to be eligible for an award.

Parents must apply online at:

online.factsmgt.com/aid. Families of students currently receiving grants are reminded that all grants are for one year only, and anyone seeking to renew a grant for the 2025-2026 school year must reapply. Deadline date for the completed application is April 25, 2025. Notification of grant awards will be made in June of 2025.

Protect Yourself from Phishing Scams

Cybersecurity threats, including phishing attempts, are on the rise, and staying vigilant is key to keeping our church, school and personal information safe. Phishing is when cybercriminals use fraudulent emails, websites, or messages to trick you into providing sensitive information like passwords, financial data, or personal details.

Red Flags of Phishing Emails:

- Suspicious Senders: Emails from unknown or unusual email addresses.
 - Example: A message that seems to be from "Fr. Smith" but comes from "john.smith987@randommail.com" instead of their actual work email address.
- **Urgent or Threatening Language**: Messages pressuring you to act quickly.
- Generic Greetings: Look out for "Dear Friend" instead of personalized greetings.
- **Unusual Requests**: Asking for sensitive information like passwords or account details.
- Misspellings and Poor Grammar: Legitimate organizations usually proofread their communications.
- Unverified Links: Hover over links without clicking to see the actual URL. Unverified URL's would be things like example.asdasdf.com

Watch Out for Impersonation Attempts:

Phishers often pose as coworkers, using email addresses or phone numbers that look similar to legitimate ones.

- Example: You receive a text message from a number claiming to be your pastor or manager, asking you to purchase gift cards and send the codes urgently.
- Always verify the sender by contacting them through a known, official channel.

How to Protect Yourself:

- Verify Requests: If you're unsure about an email, contact the sender directly using known contact information.
- Avoid Clicking Links: Type URLs into your browser instead of clicking links in emails.
- Don't Open/Download Attachments: Especially from unknown senders.
- Use Strong Passwords: Regularly update and use unique passwords for different accounts.
- **Report Suspicious Emails**: Report phishing emails, block the sender, and delete the email from your inbox.


