

Please make time to pray before the Blessed Sacrament that Day.

After Labor Day, our adult education programs begin in earnest. This includes OCIA on Wednesdays for new converts to Catholicism and That Man is You on Friday. The Michael Gormley scriptural study on the Church begins the following Monday and Women of the Word on the following Thursday. I am grateful to all those who volunteer to lead and coordinate these programs.

We have many generous volunteers who serve as readers at Mass. I offer a special invitation to be a reader at our daily Masses at 7:00 or 8:00 a.m. If you would be willing to read, please let me know and I can add you to the volunteer program.

This fall we are also beginning a relationship with Evangelical Catholic and will start some training sessions for those who want to take a more active role in witnessing to their faith. This approach will begin by engaging only a small number of parishioners individually. Evangelical Catholic looks to the model of Jesus who began by devoting most of his time to forming only 12 men as disciples who became apostles. Over time, those apostles evangelized a larger number of believers who preached the Gospel, and the growth of the Church became exponential.



When you go to the poor, you encounter Jesus The Refrigerator



This is a reflection on a recent assignment I had with our St. Vincent De Paul conference here at St. Thomas. It is an example of a typical situation we encounter in our mission to serve the poor.

My partner and I received a call from our helpline on one of the hottest days this summer. We visited the family consisting of a woman "Linda", her two teenage daughters, and her 2 year old grandson (quite a cutie). They needed a refrigerator. Theirs had been "going out" for the past week, and quit completely yesterday, making the situation urgent. Linda worked two jobs as a nurse assistant. She wasn't able to get full time hours, but said she was taking any shift available, hoping to secure a regular hospital spot. The family car was out of commission with no foreseeable way to pay for repairs. She put the payments on hold for a while, but that won't go on long without it being repossessed. Linda's sister, (who was in similar straits) was helping her with transportation while the heat was so oppressive. Linda can take the bus, but was hoping to scrape up enough money to have the car fixed by winter.

Linda reported that she was up to date on her rent and her Ameren (thanks to some once a year help from energy assistance programs), but those bills take most of her unpredictable income each month and right now funds are pretty low. She said that she had a grocery order ready to place at Wal Mart, and could put it in at midnight because her SNAP (nutrition/food stamps) benefits posted to the bank tomorrow. The problem was that she did not have money for a refrigerator, and so couldn't place the order until she had one. This currently caput fridge was in the house when she moved in, but the landlord told her that when it went, he would not be replacing. Also, one of Linda's daughters had a casted hand/arm injury she didn't seem to want to talk about.

We offered resource information (as we always do) about other sources of help for her overall situation. Linda seemed pretty savvy in this regard and in our visit, seemed focused on "milk for the baby". No other agency in our area helps with purchasing or delivering appliances, but St. Vincent De Paul tries to help with whatever is the most pressing need. We make a home visit, and we talk things over with folks.

My temptation was to judge Linda and her situation by my standards and life paradigm. Why buy a car you couldn't afford from a shady lender who preys on people? Why aren't these teenagers working to help pay the bills? Where is the baby's, and for that matter the teenager's father (s)? Do these guys help? I smell marijuana in this house, how much does that cost? Why do you keep switching jobs? However, the elements outside, and the milk container in a bag of ice in the kitchen sink pushed those thoughts aside. These questions didn't seem to matter in that moment. We could at least help this family get a refrigerator. Thankfully, thankfully, God blesses us with generous donors here at St. Thomas. We worked through it. Linda did her part and found a used fridge for around \$300 and a couple of young men to help get it in and out of the truck. (Linda's sister brought them in her car after her shift) I contacted another member of our St. Vincent De Paul group and he showed up with his truck and got it moved from the used (and I must say a little stinky in the heat) appliance store. She did get a one year warranty. Fingers crossed.

Linda was grateful, and happy she said, to "get her Walmart order in" (and of course pay a delivery fee, but there was no way around that) I have learned much about poverty in my Saint Vincent De Paul work. This case highlights the pattern of just surviving from one crisis to the next which seems universal for the people we serve. I have also learned much about myself, my attitudes, my preconceptions, and I hope, where Jesus is leading me to greater understanding and compassion. I wasn't meant to learn the answers to the questions I struggled with for Linda, valid as thy may have been, but I certainly know God tells me to help my neighbor. So, I believe the lesson in this was "There but for the Grace of God go I" and sometimes its simple... Don't we all just need a working refrigerator? With gratitude for my SDVP friends, and for our Parish,


