





When you go to the poor, you encounter Jesus



I've served in our St. Vincent de Paul Society Conference since November 2009, when home visits with those in need were introduced. We explain that our presence in their home – our practice of coming to them rather than having them come to us – is a response to Jesus, who asked us to share his love by our

service to others, especially the least of our brothers. Everyone who calls us has a story; join us and become a positive part of their story. Sixteen years later, we have many guidelines or how tos based on experiences as well as provided by the National Conference. We also have some how not tos that represent what I refer to as experience. The following story from the early days contains some how not tos that my fellow Vincentians will recognize. The following is a set of notes from 2015, five years after this 2010 encounter took place:

Today (8/11/15) is the 5^{th} anniversary of my visit with Ed, so I wanted to call him and find out how he was doing. Here is the background from 5 years ago:

St. Thomas' office had referred me to Ed, who needed a job, and the people he had been staying with wanted him and his pregnant girlfriend out ASAP. He had a job opportunity if he could get to an office off Pioneer Parkway to fill out the necessary paperwork, but he had no way to get there. I asked Ed where he was staying, and he gave me a Marquette St. address on the south side. I said, "I'll be there in about 20 minutes."

When I arrived, Ed was sitting beside his girlfriend on the steps of a small house... not a Norman Rockwell moment! He strolled over to my car as she disappeared into the house. He wore blue jeans and a muscle shirt, displaying arms saturated with tattoos. They complemented his ponytail and the numerous pins, rings, and studs in his ears and lips. I learned more about Ed as we drove out to Pioneer Parkway. He was not eligible for workers' comp or unemployment because he had not had a job for some time. He had helped a cousin mow grass and was making some money as a tattoo artist. I believed that! I asked him what he did before mowing grass, and learned that he had been released from prison about a year ago. He had served 3 1/2 years of a 6-year sentence for breaking and entering along with some kind of aggressive behavior... while trying to procure a water heater for his ex-wife because their kids lived with her on weekends, and her water heater was broken. He was confronted by police while carrying a water heater from a nearby vacant home where he had removed it in the middle of the night! I'm hearing all this as we drive to Pioneer Parkway! When we arrived at a cleaning services office on Pioneer Lane, a lady gave him papers to fill out. He was applying for the job that his buddy just lost since he was going to jail on an aggravated battery and trespassing charge. His buddy was the boyfriend of the woman who owned and rented the house that Ed had been asked to leave. He admitted that he and his buddy were not friends at this time.

As we drove back to Marquette St., Ed's cell phone rang; he had the job to clean PHA homes for \$12.34 an hour! We cheered! The only thing spiritual was me saying "praise God, who works in mysterious ways", as we speculated that the lady who wanted him out might reconsider now that her previous source of rent income was in jail and Ed had his job! Relationships get complicated! That's the background.

I couldn't locate Ed this morning (8/11/15) by phone, so I drove back to the cleaning services office. They remembered him; he had worked for them for three years. The lady at the office called Ed on a different number than I had, and he answered, so she handed her phone to me. Ed remembered me! He said that he now runs a tow truck service and was still with the same girl, and they have three children and have moved from the house on Marquette St. Ed claimed that he remembered that day we drove together 5 years ago; a new start for him, he said. And he reminded me of a piece of advice I'd given him to be successful in his new job that he had passed on to others... show up!


